






# Milk production in Malawi

- •Cows BL&W in 1970's,
- Jersey Al 2000's
- •90,000L/day, +13% /yr
- Produced by 9,000 smallholder farmers (>50% female)
- •US\$0.22/L farm price







# Milk Consumption

- 18m people, increasing by 0.5m /yr
- •<4L /capita/yr , 37% child stunting under 5yrs</p>
- 90,000L/day local production + 60,000L/day imported (WMP)
- Processed retail price 66c/L, (2L = min wage)
- Potential to increase consumption by supplying cheaper unprocessed milk to low income families





# SHMPA services

- •60 Milk collection centres, run by farmers and milk traders
- •35 Farmer livestock technicians vet and Al



- •5 field officers training, advisory support
- •Deliver farm inputs feed, drugs, AI, equipment
- Heifer loans and training for new farmers (400 women/yr)





# Malawian milk producers



- •1.5 cows, 0.4ha food crop
- •Cash income from milk, family food from crop
- •Low milk price → low cost inputs (quality and quantity)
- •Crop residues, maize bran, grass and weeds
- •Sell 5-10L/day, 1 L home use
- •+50% female farmers (matrilineal farm ownership)
- Large economic and social impact from one cow farmabove minimum wage





# Ideal dairy cows for Malawian smallholders

#### **High priority**:


- Lots of calves (ie. early return to breeding)
  - •(needed as herd replacements + surplus heifers for new farmers)
- Easy calvings
- •Milk production on small amounts of low quality feed Low priority:
- Peak milk yield, high heifer growth rates
- Heat tolerance (temperate climate in Shire Highlands)





# Jersey Island Genetics for Malawian Smallholders?

- Unique gene pool of smaller old type cows on Jersey Island
- •Identifying and preserving smaller cow families to provide genetics for farmers with limited feed resources







# Conclusion

- •Experience so far with Jersey crosses is positive they fit the Malawian farm better than BL&Ws, and the smaller ones should be even better
- •This is an urgent call to save the little old cows on Jersey Island from extinction!
